can give you...especially out side AA groups. It is being said (with all good reason) that at the least, AA offers you the removal of that damned obsession of drinking. But to get recovery beyond abstinence from alcohol we have to do something ourselves.

There are situations were service out of the group is personal motivation. At other times the alcoholic has to be reminded about the gratitude he is always taking about when sharing in closed meetings. In my experience someone had to remind me that one day I came to AA, evicted from society, and that when I came here somebody was doing what many of us are doing today.

I do remember that I volunteered myself to stand for District Chair after I finished my commitment as Alternate GSR, GSR, Secretary, and Alternate DCM. At that time I was going through a difficult situation. I had been asking, why me? I had lost my job of many years, and I was just starting to work in an area out of my district limits. In those days I used to work 12 hours every day. My family and I got used to having a good check to pay all our financial needs.

When the district elections came,

Memo from General Service Southern California Area

To: Groups in Southern California Area
From: Gustavo T., Area 05 Delegate
Date: January, 2007
Subject: New Highlights from General Service
Purpose: Group Reports, 1-2 bullets points each week

If my Higher Power allows me, I will be presenting some bullet points at the Assembly for GSR's to share at the district level to take to their groups.

- This year's General Service Conference Theme is "Our 12th Step Responsibility – Area we going to any Length?"
- General Manager, Greg M., reported on the Fellowship New Vision (FNV) project, which is the creation of an improved system to replace G.S.O.'s "Fellowship Database." In June, we issued a Request for Proposal (RFP), and vendor responses were carefully analyzed. Utopia Systems of Delaware was selected to develop the new system, which began in September. Greg was pleased to report that the development and deployment of Fellowship New Vision (FNV) was on schedule and within budget. Data is being migrated from the old "Fellowship Database" system to the new FNV platform. Employee training and system testing will run parallel with the old system during January and February 2007. Area record-keeper/registrar access will begin in March with ten added each week. Regular communications with Area record-keepers/registrars is underway in order to inform and train them on use of the new FNV system.
- Electronic Delivery of A.A. Publications (EDAP) is now available to all Conference Members. Over the next several months, additional e-mail addresses will be added manually to the database with the goal of fully automated user-defined access in September 2007. This project will provide electronic delivery of *About AA* and *Markings* in digital format.
- Greg was grateful to report that the positive trend in voluntary contributions continues. Contributions through October 2006 are 10% ahead of budget and 12% greater than last year. Preliminary results for November indicate that contributions are within budget projections. Each contribution, whether large or small, represents a spiritual sacrifice made by A.A. members and groups, and makes a significant difference in strengthening the services offered by the General Service Office to members and groups.
- The [A.A.W.S. Publishing Committee's](#) recommendation to reduce the price of the audio CD set, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, Fourth Edition (M-81) from \$85.00 to \$55.00, was approved by the Board.
- The General Service Conference this year will be held from April 22nd-April 29th in New York and PRAASA from March 2nd to March 3rd.

I had already decided not to volunteer for any service position at the district level.... giving as an excuse the distance and lack of time for a service position. I couldn't even make it to my original home group...my home group actually became the district. When I was asked if I was available to stand for DCM I did present all the above excuses. At that meeting somebody told them that with help of an alternate I may go forward. That made me change my mind a little bit, but what really encouraged me to stand, was to see into the eyes of my Home Group GSR (La Esperanza) and to remember what he said in 1995... that was the year I was alternate coordinator (chair) for my group. During his service, the chair had left his commitment (he was a newcomer) and they asked me if I was available to fill the position. I did answer like I did at the district: I have too much work; I live too far from the home group, etc, etc. At that time my fellow Miguel J. standing up says: I've been thinking that I would like to serve in this group (he was coming from another group) but I can see that in this group they are not real AA's, Alcoholics who love AA as a whole; so I may have to look for a group where I can find fellows who really are Alcoholics Anonymous. His words stuck me, and it came to me I was the kind of person who always left projects unfinished, even in my previous time in AA, and I didn't try to correct myself of this defect. Therefore, if I really want to erase that experience, now was the opportunity.

The service position was given to me, and my fellows, I can tell you It has been truly one of the best experiences of my life in AA. This experience has given me a stronger belief, or faith in a Higher Power. A very little time after I had accepted this commitment, my old job was given back to me with the same salary and benefits. I think that many times our Higher Power sends us difficulties so we can practice what AA teaches us. We do not know why things happen. Only our Higher Power knows if something is ahead of us for a reason.

In the last two years as a DCM we have only missed two times a steering committee meeting or a group visit... and this was do to changes of schedule or a very important reason.

By the end of 2006 we hosted the Spanish Speaking Foro and our district gave the biggest contribution in years. It is possible that my service as DCM helped in some way. Many times an old timer like me has nothing to do but just be there in case we're asked to make a suggestion. It is what I did at the foro planning meetings.

In regards to participating in other foros, our district has attended most of them. One of the times that I didn't attended an event was the International Convention in Canada, but like somebody at the elections stated, "that's why the alternate it is always needed". Thanks Juan M. for your support on these visits that I wasn't able to attend.

Another thing that gives me satisfaction is that our fellow alcoholics from Pomona Valley come in big numbers to our district. I hope that in the near future somebody from that valley will make themselves available to be DCM.

With regards to Area 05, there was significant progress. We have more GSR'S attending the area events, also individuals from our district taking commitments at the area level.

Next year probably I won't be coming regularly to continue serving our community at area level. It is possible that in a short time you will not even remember that one day I was serving to you, . But you can be sure that I will always have a special place for you in my heart. You not only gave me the opportunity to serve but the opportunity to grow up a little bit in this great world of Alcoholics Anonymous.

May our Higher Power give lots of blessings to you and your families. Let's continue serving only for today for that is the most important thing in our lives.

Some day we may have to go. I don't know where, but as our literature says:" We shall be with you in the fellowship of the spirit, and you will surely meet some of us on the Road of Happy Destiny.
